



MORE THAN FOOD AND CLOTHING

While our food pantry and clothing department are the cornerstones of ChesedChicago's work, they're only part of the story. Behind the scenes, we also run a number of smaller, carefully targeted programs that quietly provide critical help to individuals and families. These initiatives may not be as visible, but they are just as vital—and they depend on the same resources and generosity that sustain our larger efforts.



We help couples afford costly fertility treatments, cover extraordinary medical expenses for families facing emergencies, and offer meaningful financial support to single parents working hard to care for their children. We also assist with modest wedding costs for families experiencing hardship and we connect youth with mentors who provide guidance, encouragement, and stability.

These programs reflect the heart of our mission: to meet people with dignity wherever they are, and to respond with compassion in moments that matter most. They also stretch our budget significantly. Every dollar we raise helps us continue to support the families who turn to us—not just for food or clothing, but for hope, healing, and a stronger future. **




