

HELPING COUPLES ACHIEVE The Dream OF PARENTHOOD

Many of us know people who are struggling to start a family. Current statistics show that one out of every six couples is faced with infertility. The pain of childlessness is something no couple should have to endure. Chesed-Chicago tries to reduce the financial strain this challenge has on couples by providing financial assistance, allowing them to pursue fertility treatments.

ChesedChicago has enjoyed a long-standing relationship with Dr. Ilan Tur-Kaspa, of IHR (Institute for Human Reproduction), who has partnered with us in this important and meaningful endeavor.

Here's a recent conversation we had with Dr. Tur-Kaspa about his amazing work.

How did you come to start working with Rabbi Fuerst and ChesedChicago?

After I founded the Institute for Human Reproduction in Chicago (in 2004), Rabbi Shmuel Fuerst visited me at Ilan Tur-Kaspa, MD, is an international specialist in Reproductive Medicine and Infertility. Dr Tur-Kaspa was born in Israel. He graduated from Hadassah Medical School-Hebrew University and specializes in Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Medicine and Infertility in Israel and the US.

He is the Founder, President & co-Medical Director of the Institute for Human Reproduction (IHR) in IL, IN, and WI. He specializes in personalized fertility care, advanced Assisted Reproductive Technologies (ART), AI to optimize IVF outcomes, reproductive imaging, and fertility preservation. He is one of the world's most experienced fertility specialists involved in advanced IVF/ICSI treatment with preimplantation genetic testing (PGT). Besides the thousands of ART treatments he conducted over the years, over 3500 were IVF/ICSI-PGT cycles, to assist couples in conceiving a healthy child, for single gene disorders, translocations, HLA matched child (to save a sick sibling), and for aneuploidy.

Dr. Tur-Kaspa is the author/coauthor of 110+ peer-reviewed scientific publications and book chapters, and he is a co-editor of the books "Ultrasound Imaging in Reproductive Medicine" (2014, 2019) and "Biotechnology of Human Reproduction" (2003). He had served as a Professor at the REI Division, Dept of OB/ GYN, University of Chicago, and as President of the Chicago Association of Reproductive Endocrinologists. He was the 2020-2021 Chair of the Reproductive Imaging Special Interest Group of the American Society of Reproductive Medicine (ASRM).

the clinic. It was an honor to meet him and to be able to discuss advances in fertility treatments as well as how to integrate the halacha into the clinical setting. He told me about Chesed-Chicago, and I immediately responded that I'd be happy to assist. Aside from helping medically, I wanted to be involved with part of the financial support needed for the couples to fulfill their dreams of a family and fulfill the commandment to 'be fruitful and multiply'. I've learned a lot from Rabbi Fuerst over the years, and he has referred couples to consult with me when trying to conceive. This 'fruitful' relationship has continued since our first meeting; with him, his family, and the amazing ChesedChicago.

What exactly do you do?

When I'm asked: 'What do you do?' My initial response is 'I make people happy'!

As a fertility specialist, I try to be a good 'shaliach' helping couples to build a family. Aside from the physical aspect, fertility treatment involves addressing the emotional roller-coaster, anxiety, shame, fears, and sometimes difficulties within the couple's relationship. I treat female infertility, male infertility, and repeated pregnancy loss. We highly respect and keep the Torah's halachos. We are happy to say that today, bez'H, we can assist almost everyone to have as many children as they wish for.

What motivates you to stay involved with ChesedChicago?

Each year, ChesedChicago provides hundreds of thousands of dollars to cover the prohibitive costs of fertility treatments.

How did you get involved with volunteering at ChesedChicago?

I went to Israel in February on a JUF TOV volunteer trip, and for our group reunion a month later, we volunteered at ChesedChicago. I had never heard of the organization before, but once I started, I loved it. When I saw and realized what they do for the Jewish community and how much help they need, I thought 'what kind of better place than to come here and help out'!

What does a typical volunteer day look like for you?

When I first came with our group, we created an assembly line to prepare the Pesach provision boxes. I came back on my own to help stock the shelves for Pesach. I also came for the big food distribution day before Pesach. All the cars came through in a line and we loaded them up. That was fun! I was the onion runner.

Now that the busy Pesach season is done, I come in weekly to help in the food pantry. I can't believe how much stuff has come in from the spring food drive. It's kind of fun, keeping the shelves organized and well-stocked.

In your opinion, what is the most important work that CC does?

Being a safety net for people to have a place to go when they are in need.

What inspires you to stay involved at ChesedChicago on a consistent basis?

Everyone here is so wonderful and welcoming. I'm not observant, but I'm traditional and I feel very comfortable here. After I came the first time, I was hooked. I like the way it makes me feel to be here, while at the same time, helping out. ChesedChicago is my happy place!

Do you have an anecdote about ChesedChicago that really moved you?

I learned something important when I came to ChesedChicago: I didn't realize how many people in the Jewish community are struggling. That was shocking. And I see how much ChesedChicago does for the community and how appreciative people are. It's so wonderful to do something where you feel you are making a real difference.

If you could tell future CC volunteers one thing, what would it be?
